

Hope Funds for Cancer Research Announces Newly Elected Chairman of the Board

Newport, RI - December 14, 2012 - Hope Funds for Cancer Research, dedicated to advancing innovative research for the most difficult-to-treat cancers, today announced Malcolm A.S. Moore, DPhil, has been elected chairman of its Board of Trustees.

"Dr. Moore is an ideal choice to lead the Hope Funds Board of Trustees," said Leah Rush Cann, Hope Funds founder and Chair of its Executive Committee. "His scientific accomplishments and drug development experience, his experience mentoring young scientists, and his experience as a patient make him uniquely suited for the role."

Dr. Moore received his Bachelor of Medicine and Doctor of Philosophy degrees from the University of Oxford. Shortly thereafter he was appointed a Prize Fellow at Magdalen College, Oxford. He was a Queen Elizabeth II Visiting Fellow and Senior Research Scientist and Head of the Laboratory of Developmental Biology at the Walter and Eliza Hall Institute of Medical Research in Melbourne, Australia.

Since 1974 he has been a Member at the Sloan-Kettering Institute for Cancer Research and heads the James Ewing Laboratory of Developmental Hematopoiesis. He is perhaps best known for identifying and purifying a human growth factor, G-CSF, that stimulates white blood cell production (neutrophils). In collaboration with Amgen, recombinant G-CSF (Neupogen) was developed. This therapy has significantly improved survival in cancer patients.

Dr. Moore received the Hope Funds Award of Excellence for Clinical Development in 2008 and has served on the Hope Funds Scientific Advisory Council since 2009. He succeeds Jonathan Lewis, MD, PhD, who has been named Development Committee Chairman and a member of the Executive Committee.
